FRANCOPHONE NETWORK OF AGE-FRIENDLY CITIES

Created in 2012, the Francophone Network of Age-friendly cities (FNAFC) is an independent and general interest association, affiliated to the World Health Organisation (WHO) Global Network for Age-friendly Cities and Communities (GNAFCC). It is the only organization officially affiliated to the GNAFCC in France. The FNAFC is a resources centre full of expertise on how to accompany territories to deal with the issues of aging. Its aim is to promote and develop the Age-Friendly Cities Approach at a francophone level in order to encourage representatives to take into account the issues linked to the demographic transition in their policies.

DEMOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

During our century, we are growing older and healthier. This longer life expectancy fully modifies our society which is now composed of four or five generations. Longevity is a challenge that needs to be included in the local public policies in order to help people to find their place in society and in their territory when they grow old. To do that, all city representatives, city professionals and their partners (who can be public, private, institutional or associative ones) needs to take into account the specificities and heterogeneity of the "older people" group to include them in new projects.

Solutions can be implemented at different decision-making levels (city, region, nation) taking into account the territory's characteristics and its advantages in order to lead global policies. To encourage and accompany the cities in the transformation and adaptation of their aging public policies by using innovative methods, the FNAFC offers its expertise and makes its skills available to the territories.






Distribution of the members according to their size and college
